

**REQUEST FOR DOCUMENTS AND INFORMATION
FROM THE AKRON-AAUP
TO THE UNIVERSITY OF AKRON
AUGUST 31, 2020**

The American Association of University Professors, The University of Akron Chapter (the “Chapter”) requests The University of Akron (the “University”) to provide the documents and information listed below. These requests relate to documents or information which the University possesses, whether produced by the University or some third party.

When responding to this request, the University shall also produce any and all drafts and attachments to the documents and/or information produced pursuant to this request. The University shall also produce any and all keys to the documents provided. Where no keys exist, the University shall produce a separate list of all accounts included in each document produced.

These Requests for Documents and Information are to be considered as continuing and the Administration is requested to provide, by way of supplementary responses, such additional documents as the Administration may hereafter obtain, which will augment or otherwise supplement the Administration’s response now given to these Requests. Such supplementary responses are to be served upon the Chapter as quickly as possible after receipt or creation of such information or documents.

To the extent the University claims a legal basis for not producing documents and/or information as to part or all of a request, state with specificity the basis for such non-production and comply with as much of the request as possible, accounting for the University’s legal objection.

Produce the following documents and information:

1. Identify all instances where individuals serving as instructors for the University in the Fall 2020 Semester have been offered to utilize and/or are utilizing in any, teaching materials and/or examination materials (collectively, the “Materials”) created by faculty on the July 2020 Reduction in Force list;
2. For all instances identified in response to Item #1, produce all documents relating in any way to said utilization of the Materials created by faculty on the July 2020 Reduction in Force list;
3. To the extent not encompassed by the response to Item #2, identify any requests for permission to use the Materials created by faculty on the July 2020 Reduction in Force list and any responses to such requests;

4. For all instances identified in response to Item #1, state the University's position as to whether the Materials at issue created by faculty on the July 2020 Reduction in Force list were created with "substantial support" (as that term is defined in the MOU Regarding Intellectual Property between the Chapter and the University) from the University;
5. For all instances identified in response to Item #4, produce all documents relating in any way to the University's position that the Materials at issue created by faculty on the July 2020 Reduction in Force list were created with "substantial support" (as that term is defined in the MOU Regarding Intellectual Property between the Chapter and the University) from the University;
6. Identify all instances where any University employee or agent has provided instruction, guidance, direction, etc. regarding use of the Materials created by faculty on the July 2020 Reduction in Force list to any individual serving as instructors for the University in the Fall 2020 Semester; and
7. For all instances identified in response to Item #6, produce all documents relating in any way to the instruction, guidance, direction, etc. at issue.
